Technical Seminar – Talk on “Implementation Strategy of the SIL(E) Project”

Synopsis:

The SIL (East) is one of the ten major infrastructure projects the Chief Executive announced in his Policy Address in October 2007. It is a seven-kilometre long railway that will provide domestic passenger services between Admiralty and South Horizons, with three intermediate stations near Ocean Park, at Wong Chuk Hang and Lei Tung Estate. Passengers will be able to interchange at Admiralty for the existing MTR Island Line, Tsuen Wan Line and the future Shatin Central Link. The SIL (East) will run in tunnels and viaducts according to topography, and will be implemented as an MTRCL project under the ownership approach. A site at the ex-Wong Chuk Hang Estate has been reserved for rail plus property development on top of the depot for the SIL (East). Both target cost and traditional lump sum tender approaches are adopted for the procurement of the SIL (East) civil works contracts according to the complexity of the works scope and its associated risks.

Presenter

Ken Wong is a Construction Manager of MTRCL for the two tunnel contracts of the SIL (East). He has over 28-year construction experience working for contractors, consultants and clients. Ken has been involved in major tunnel and railway projects since 1987 including Junk Bay Road Tunnels, Tolo Harbour Effluent Tunnel, Breamar Hill Gas Pipeline Tunnel, Taipei Metro, Western Harbour Crossing, West Rail Tai Lam Tunnel, Lok Ma Chau Spur Line Tunnels, Kowloon Southern Link and SIL (East).
